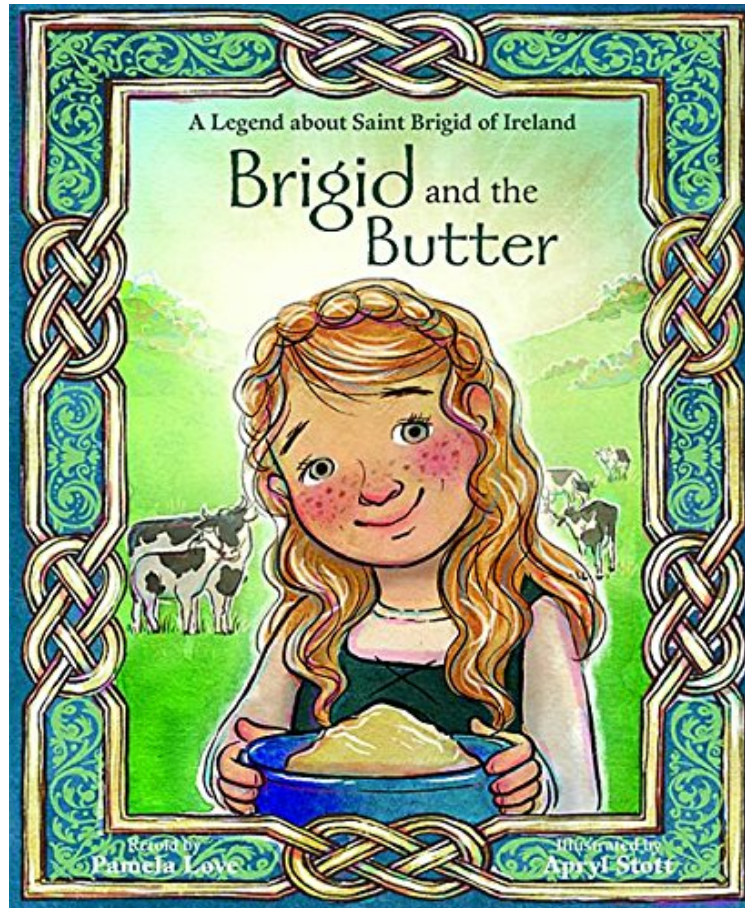

The story and the illustrations are loved by all three of my children ages 10, 9 and 6. In fact I might need to get a second copy of this book because both my girls want to carry it around the house. Pamela Love in her first book for Pauline and from our reading we hope there will be many more. This is the retelling of one of the legends of St. Brigid of Ireland. And it is wonderfully retold. The story of the young slave girl who must decide between sharing what little she has, or possibly going hungry makes a very hard choice. In part the choice is inspired by a sermon from Bishop Patrick (St. Patrick) preaching on the loaves and the fish. It is an inspiring story. Every time we read it we end up discussing giving, and giving from what we have. We also talk about sermons and following God's leading no matter the challenge. The illustrations by April Stott are

incredible. My youngest has asked for a framed version of the portrait of St. Brigid from the end of the book.
