From a behavioral pharmacology perspective, combining a stimulant like ephedra with cannabis in the Soma mixture, as suggested by some archeologists, is more

compatible with the aggressive behavior of the God-intoxicated Aryans which was immortalized in the Vedas - it makes sense that what was lost was the knowledge of the ratio of the components of Soma rather than the knowledge of the properties of the individual plants, which have never ceased to be used.
