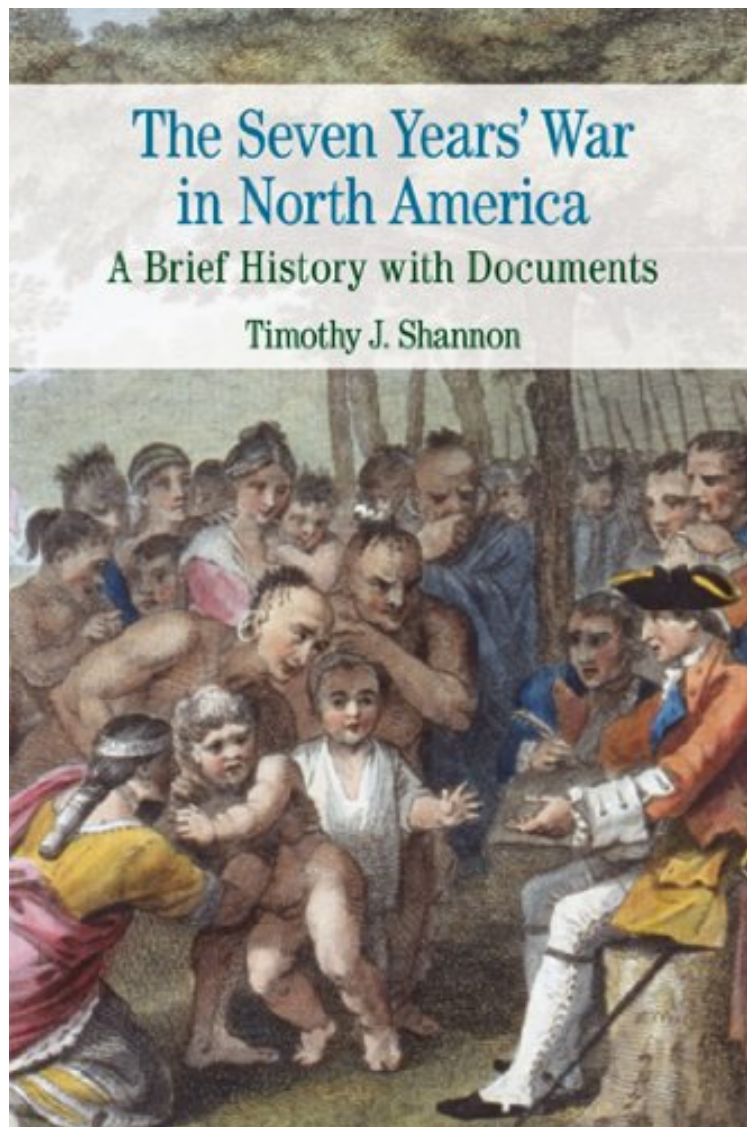

Earlier generations have been deprived of, or not taken advantage of, the opportunity to learn about this most important and decisive war, which settled the score in many ways between France and England in America and elsewhere in the 18th century, and laid the foundation for the American Revolution. Use of the various source documents for the commentary is an extremely effective way to teach the subject, as well as, hopefully, to instill curiosity in the students to read other such documents to improve their understanding of this most important era and critically examine this period of our nation's history. This book is accurate, concise, and easily read and covers all topics from the French perspective, the complicated American Indian confederacies to Braddock's defeat, British campaigns and the seeds of Pontiac's rebellion. It thoroughly covers the subject with good references to continue learning about the events of this time, as well as to inspire students to learn about the related happenings in Europe which dominated the efforts of France to try to protect its interest there at the expense of the loss of New France. The introduction surveys the war as both an international struggle for empire and an intercultural conflict involving Native Americans, French and British soldiers, and the ethnically and religiously diverse population of British North America. A rich collection of primary-source selections recaptures the experience of the war from multiple perspectives and is organized by key cultural, military, and diplomatic themes. Document headnotes, a chronology, questions to consider, and a bibliography enrich students understanding of this momentous conflict.
