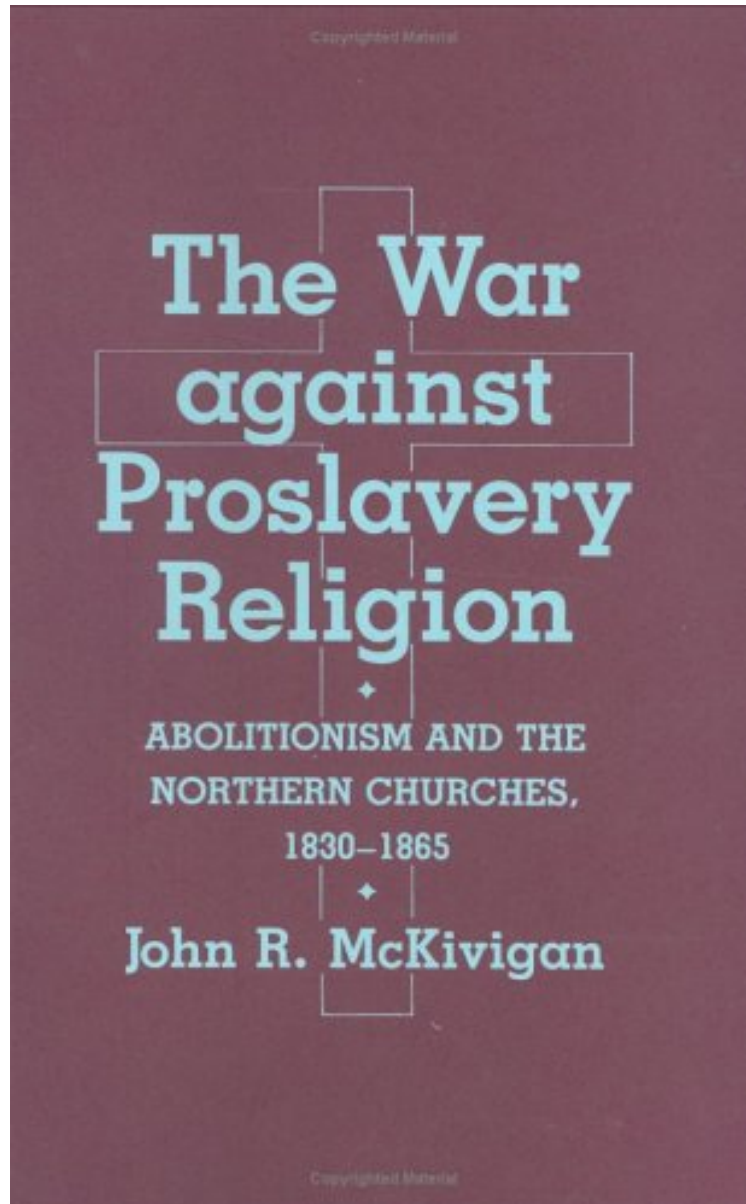

Blum This is straight forward history of the conflicts between the northern and southern churches leading up to the Civil War. What is most interesting is that it destroys the popular myth that the churches were in the vanguard of the abolition movement. While there were some churches that were, they were the off shoots of the more established churches. It appears that the established churches were more interested in staying neutral and not creating conflict with their southern brethren than in fighting the evil of slavery. The book has been written in a scholarly manner and is very dry reading. But, for anyone who wishes to understand the role that the churches played, or didn't play, in the abolition movement the book is a good read.
